

Sixth Form Uniform Policy

Sixth Form students are expected to support Dubai British School by wearing uniform smartly and in the spirit of the business environment. Sixth Formers are role models for younger pupils and the way they dress is very important to the whole school. Expectations are based around the type of clothes and appearance that would be accepted in the workplace.

The 2016/17 academic year will be a transition year in which Sixth Form students may wear either the current school uniform or approved business attire.

Sixth Form – Current Policy for Reference

	Standard	Allowed	Not Allowed
Shirt & Jumper	Regulation issue DBS school shirt from Zaks Plain black jumper only	Girls and boys may wear their shirts tucked in or untucked	No logos or unusual textures/ fabrics* No colour other than black. Top buttons undone. Shirt sleeves rolled up or tucked in.
Trousers	Regulation issue DBS school trousers from Zaks. They should be plain black, full length, work smart trousers.	Full length trousers only.	They should not be made of denim or denim-like material; they should have no additional colours or patterns on them. They should not be skinny or tight fitting. There should be no metallic zips.
Skirt	Regulation issue DBS school skirt from Zaks. Skirt should be a plain black, knee length, work smart skirt.	Knee length as a minimum.	Hems taken up above the knee. They should not be tight fitting, made of lycra and they should have no additional colours or patterns on them, i.e. metallic zips. There should be no excessive slips.
Shoes & Socks	Plain black, closed toe, flat shoes.	Shoes can be leather or suede.	Trainers, patterned shoes, embellishments on shoes such as metal bars, heels, any other colour socks.
Hair	Neat and tidy at all times, and hair colour should be on the natural colour spectrum.	Hair may be worn down, provided it is neat and tidy. Sixth Form boys may grow a beard but this must be well maintained, neat and tidy.*	Overly excessive hair accessories;
Makeup	Makeup should be subtle and natural. Nail varnish may be worn but the colours must be subtle and neutral*	Foundation or other face makeup that is flesh-coloured and not noticeable.	No coloured lipstick/gloss/eye shadow or mascara. Coloured nail varnish.
Jewellery & Tattoos	Some jewellery is allowed (as outlined); Tattoos are not allowed	1 pair of stud earrings in the lower ear, 1 plain bracelet, 1 plain necklace, 1 ring, 1 watch. Nose/cartilage piercings should be clear and not visible.	Any other visible piercings other than one per ear – piercings higher in the ear should either be removed for school or covered with a plaster. Ankle bracelets; Tattoos of any kind.
